Some Ways to Support Your Child's Learning at Home

Here are some fun, everyday activities that you can do with your child to help them develop essential early literacy and numeracy skills:

- sometimes, talk about the stories that you read together. Ask questions that require more than just a yes or no answer. "What was that your favourite part?" "Why was that your favourite

part?" ... These are called open-ended questions.

- have some dress-up clothes available for your child to use – 'make believe' gives your child an opportunity to practice their language and communication skills
- show that writing serves a purpose – make a shopping list together (your child could draw a picture of some items next to the words); let them do a simple drawing or card, and mail it!
- think out loud – it is a great way to 'model' to your child how you solve problems.
- play number and counting games when you are out together – how many red cars can you see?; who can be the first to see the number 4 on a number plate?...
- play simple number and counting games at home – board games are fantastic!
- let your child see and hear you as you use numbers and counting for real reasons – counting out enough plates, counting ingredients during cooking, and checking your change
- encourage them to look for smaller collections inside a bigger collection, for example, 7 pieces of apple could be separated into collections of 1 and 6, 2 and 5, 3 and 4
- play with blocks – apart from having fun playing with blocks, they are also great for developing early skills – counting, grouping, shape recognition, ordering according to size or mass (weight), making patterns, problem solving...
- use describing and comparing language – longer/shorter, heavier/lighter, holds more/less when comparing objects – this helps to form ideas about what we can measure, and why

Recipe

Caramel swirl cheesecake

- 250g plain sweet biscuits
- 125g butter, melted
- 500g cream cheese, softened
- 1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 eggs
- 3/4 cup thickened cream
- 2 tablespoons plain flour

Caramel

- 8 caramel chews
- 2 tablespoons thickened cream

Caramel sauce

- 1 cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 300mls thickened cream
- 60g butter, chopped



Preheat oven to 160°C/140°C fan-forced. Grease a 6cm-deep, 19cm square cake pan. Line base and sides with baking paper, allowing a 5cm overhang.

Place biscuits in a processor. Process until fine crumbs form. Add butter. Process until combined. Press mixture into base of prepared pan. Refrigerate for 30 minutes.

Meanwhile, make caramel: Place caramels and cream in a small saucepan over medium-low heat. Cook, stirring, for 2 to 3 minutes or until smooth. Remove from heat.

Using an electric mixer, beat cream cheese, sugar and vanilla until smooth. Add eggs, 1 at a time, beating after each addition. Beat in cream and flour until just combined.

Pour mixture into prepared pan. Place spoonfuls of caramel on cheese mixture. Using a wooden skewer, swirl through caramel. Bake for 50 minutes or until centre is almost set. Cool in oven for 3 hours with door slightly ajar. Refrigerate overnight.

Make caramel sauce: Place sugar, cream and butter in a saucepan over medium heat. Cook, stirring, for 4 to 5 minutes or until boiling. Reduce heat to low. Simmer for 2 minutes or until slightly thickened. Remove from heat. Set aside for 10 to 15 minutes to cool slightly. Serve cheesecake with caramel sauce.

Cheesy Vegemite pull-apart

Ingredients:


- 2 cups self-raising flour
- 30g butter, chilled, chopped
- 3/4 cup reduced-fat milk
- 1 tablespoon Vegemite
- 3/4 cup grated reduced-fat tasty cheese
- Reduced-fat milk, to glaze

Method


Preheat oven to 220°C/200°C fan-forced. Line a baking tray with baking paper. Sift flour into a bowl. Using fingertips, rub butter into flour until mixture resembles breadcrumbs. Make a well in the centre. Add milk. Using a flat-bladed knife, stir until mixture forms a soft dough, adding more milk if necessary. Turn out onto a lightly floured surface. Knead gently until smooth (don't over-knead).

Roll out to a 30cm x 20cm rectangle. Spread Vegemite over dough, leaving a 1cm strip along 1 long side. Sprinkle cheese over Vegemite. Roll up firmly. Transfer to prepared tray, seam-side down.

Using scissors, cut into top of dough at 3cm intervals without cutting all the way through. Pull slices to the left and right. Brush with milk. Bake for 20 to 25 minutes or until golden. Serve.
