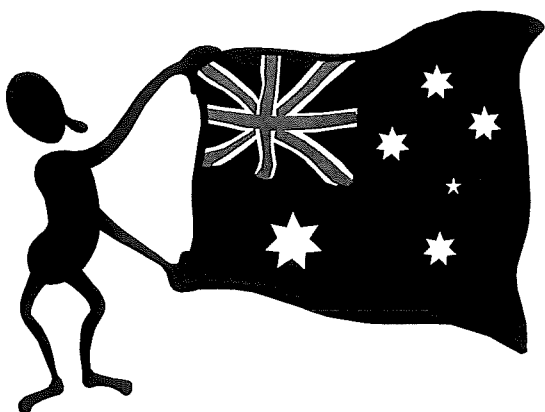

Premier's Australia Day Active Citizenship Awards

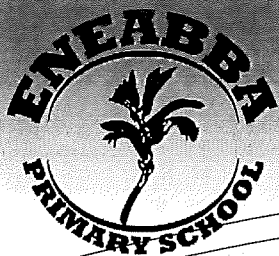
The Shire of Carnamah invites you to nominate an outstanding individual or group for one of the 2015 Premier's Australia Day Active Citizenship Awards.

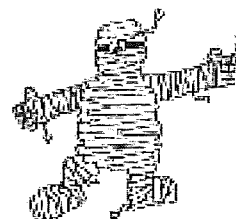

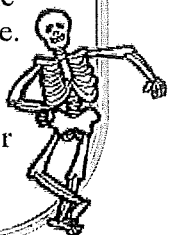

The students are required to present a poem/prose, read a passage from a book and talk on a given theme according to their age. Many interesting and varied topics are usually covered in the student talks. We need parents to assist their children by listening to them practice at home. This would be greatly appreciated and help the children to become confident in speaking aloud. A proposed timetable is attached to this newsletter. The first part of the AASS will be activities/sports at school followed by a session at the pool. For the pool session if you don't hold a season ticket the cost of entry will be \$2.10 per child. Children walking across from the school to the pool will need to be accompanied by their parent or driven to the pool by their parent. AASS is coming to an end in its present format but we have been informed that there will be a new Sporting Schools Program commencing in late 2015.

Next Tuesday, Melbourne Cup day will be a "Mad Hat Day" for students. Students are invited to make and wear a hat on the day with judging of the best hat being in the Categories: Best Junior Girl, Best Junior Boy, Best Senior Girl and Best Senior Boy hat. The junior room students dressed as their favourite book or story character and the senior room as their favourite musical character. During the day the students will be taking part in workshops looking at writing songs for known stories, jingles for adverts, cooking for stories they know e.g. "The Gingerbread Man". The book Fair will also be happening on the day with a large a varied range of books and gifts available for purchase. All are welcome.

In 2015 Eneabba PS is booked with Badgingarra PS for a camp in Canberra from 26th June to 2nd July. Even though still 6 months away we have had notification advising us to start considering flight bookings. We are being sent quotes and costing to allow us to start our fundraising toward next year's camp.

The Federal Government has just announced, Australian school students will sit their NAPLAN tests online from 2016. Education Minister Christopher Pyne guaranteed \$24.7 million to construct the online platform to demonstrate the Government's commitment to helping deliver the better-quality results schools, parents, teachers and students will see from online NAPLAN tests.

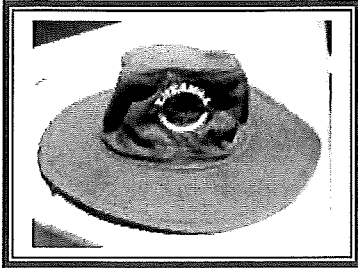

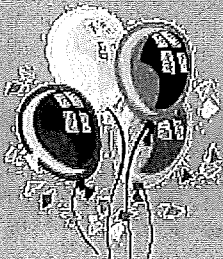

But it is not always easy. Take some time to investigate free healthy eating tips, tools and resources to get you and your family back on track and put your health first.

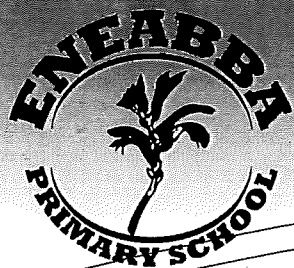

From the Principal's desk...

It has been a busy last two weeks and today the year 3 to 7 students are in Three Springs as part of the T20 Blast cricket Carnival. 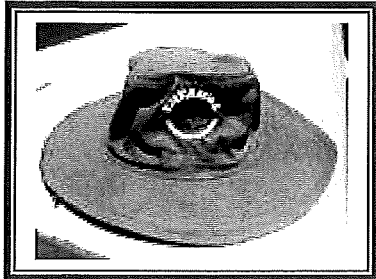

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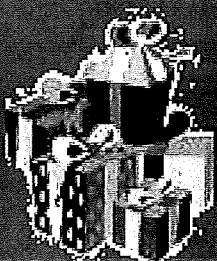

The Year 6 & 7 Graduation Dinner will be held at the ESS Camp at 5.30pm. More details were be sent out once confirmed.

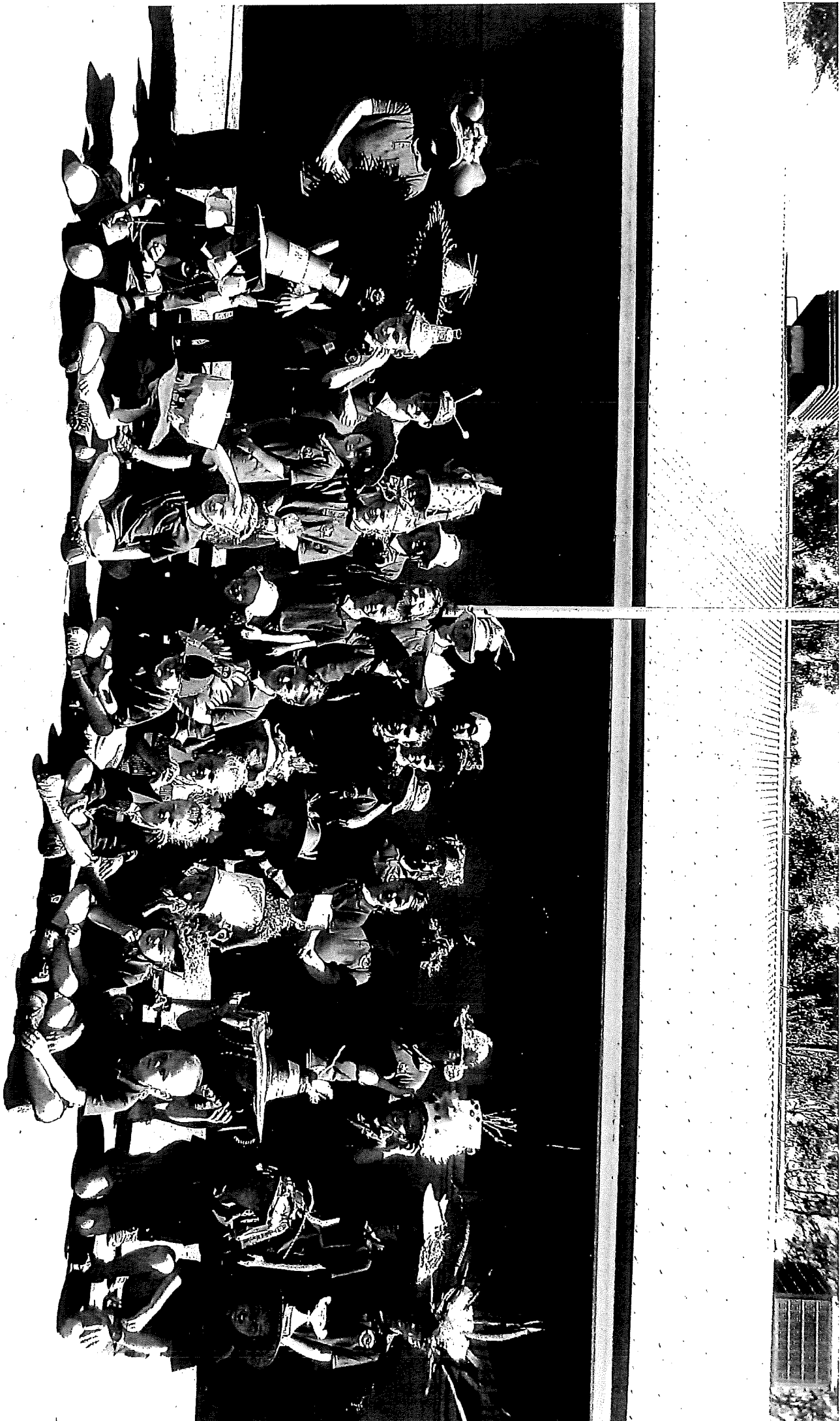
Eneabba Primary School Concert

Blood pressure & blood sugar levels: When was the last time you had yours checked? Come and see me.

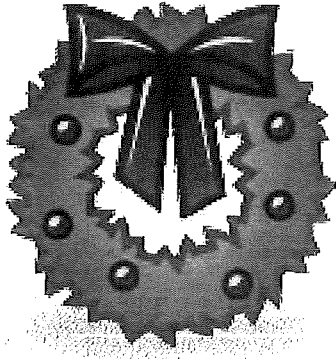

With party season here, these crisp mini rostis - topped with sour cream and smoked salmon - make the perfect canapés.

Ingredients

- ☐ 3 medium peeled red Delight potatoes, coarsely grated
- ☐ 1 lightly whisked egg
- ☐ 2 tablespoons plain flour
- ☐ 20g melted butter
- ☐ Salt and pepper
- ☐ 1 tablespoon olive oil
- ☐ Sour cream, sliced smoked salmon and chopped fresh dill to serve

Method

1. Place peeled and grated potato in a colander and squeeze out all moisture. Transfer to a large bowl, then add egg, flour butter. Season with salt and pepper. Heat oil in a frying pan over medium-high heat. Add heaped tablespoonfuls of the potato mixture and flatten slightly with an egg lifter. Cook for 1-2 minutes each side or until crisp and golden then drain on paper towel. Repeat with the remaining potato mixture and allow to cool slightly. Top each rosti with a dollop of sour cream, sliced smoked salmon and chopped fresh dill. Season with cracked black pepper.
