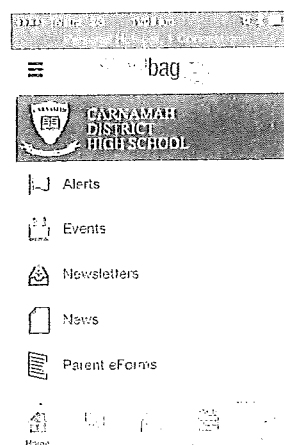
Exciting News: Carnamah DHS 'App' Goes Live!

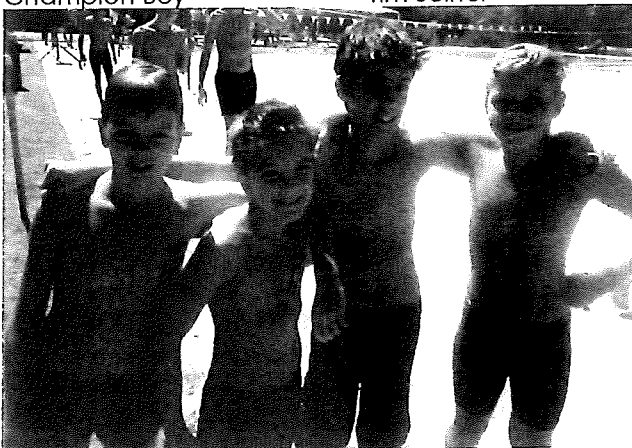

School and P & C Notices



Year 11 and 12 Course Charges

Year 11 and 12 students are required to pay course charges. These are due by the end of Term 1. Students who have not paid these charges will not be able to participate in the practical aspects of some courses from Term 2.

Secondary Assistance

Any Parent/Guardian who holds a Centrelink Family Health Card, Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card or Veteran's Affairs Pensioner Concession Card and have student/s in Years 8 - 12 can claim a Secondary Assistance allowance up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age. Applications can be made at the School Office, but the card MUST be sighted.

Some Ways to Support Your Child's Learning at Home

Learning to write and spell are two key skills your children will learn and develop during their early years at school. They develop these skills by reading and watching other people write. As they become more confident, they begin to recognise words, talk about letters and sounds, and make out patterns.

Children who are confident with writing and spelling have a great start to school. You can help your children gain this confidence by doing these simple activities at home.

1. Kindergarten: Children begin to experiment with forming letters and learn that printed words carry a message. Have fun playing games with letters and words. Just a minute or two regularly works best at this young age.

Read alphabet books, story books and nursery rhymes to your children. Point to words that are

- easily matched to a picture, such as *cat* and *hat*.
- Help your children recognise their names. Start with just the first letter. Point it out when you see it in another word.
- Write words together. Help them trace over words with their fingers while you say each letter out loud.
- As you are reading, talk about words together. Ask questions, for example: *What is the longest word on the page?*

2. Pre-primary: Children learn more about spelling and start to understand the connection between sounds and letters. They begin to write the most obvious sounds in a word such as *WT* for *went* and *KTN* for *kitten*. They can also spell some words they know such as *the* and *to*.

- Set up a home message board and write messages to your children. Encourage them to leave messages too.
- Write shopping lists with your children. Talk about what you are doing and writing.
- Make use of junk mail by asking children to:
 - circle words that have a certain letter such as *M* and a certain sound like *SH*
 - underline all two letter words, three letter words and so on
 - count how many times they can find a certain word such as *the* as this helps them recognise common words.

3. Years 1 and 2: As your children progress through school they develop a bank of words they recognise by sight. They are also able to match letters with sounds and sound out words they don't know.

- Ask your children to 'have a go' at spelling words before giving them the correct answer.
- See how many words can be made from one large word like *together* using only the letters in that word. For example: *he, get, greet, there* and *other*.
- Ask your children to keep a diary during the holidays. Get them to write something in it each day. Add and caption photographs. Decorate the pages together.
- Help your children write lists when they play, for example shopping lists.

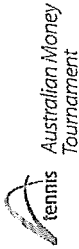

EASTER TOURNAMENT NOTES AND CONDITIONS

1. This tournament is sanctioned by Tennis West and will be conducted under the present Rules of Tennis and the Rules and Regulations of the Lawn Tennis Association of Australia and Western Australia. The Tennis West Code for tennis attire will apply. No entry will be accepted from any player who is not a member of a club or association affiliated with Tennis West.
2. The Tennis Code of Conduct and Tennis West Behavior Code shall apply and will be displayed at the courts for the perusal by competitors - penalties may be imposed under both or either codes. Play will be continuous in all sets matches i.e. There will be no 10 minute break in a match standing at 1 set all. The only exception will be as the Referee, at his discretion, may approve. No one may advise a competitor during the playing of a match except at an official break.
3. The Committee has the entire management of the Tournament. It also reserves the right to:
- (a) Re-allocate a player's nominated grade where necessary for tournament reasons
 - (b) Cancel or amalgamate events for which there are insufficient entries and to divide any event into grades should the number of entries warrant such an action.
 - (c) Use hard courts to facilitate the completion of the tournament (Non AR Points events only)
4. A sanction fee of \$5 per player is included in the Entry Fees.
5. Entrants for Junior events must obey the junior policy of the Geraldton Tennis Club, "No Hat - No Play"
6. Play will begin each day at the advertised starting time. Competitors must be at the courts and ready to play at the time fixed, irrespective of weather conditions. Penalties, at the discretion of the Committee, may apply for late check in. Check in 15 minutes prior to match.
7. The Full Draws and Schedule of Play will be available by 8pm Tuesday APRIL 15th.
8. Play will commence by 12:00 Noon Friday 18th APRIL for all AMT & 18 and Under Singles Qualifying events and all Mixed Doubles events. It may also be necessary for some junior events to commence during Friday afternoon.
9. No player may enter more than four (4) events, providing one of the four events is a Mixed Doubles event. In addition to this, No Player May enter more than one mixed doubles event and players entering the 18/AMT events are only permitted to enter a total of three (3) events.
10. Entrants in Junior and Seniors events must be the specified age as at April 30th 2014.
11. (a) Championship Singles events shall be the best of three twelve point tiebreak sets.

Fundraising auction a monster success

Over 200 people converged on the Mingenew Polocrosse grounds on Saturday 15 March to have a punt on the household and farm items up for grabs as part of Mingenew Monster Auction.
