- Active within both the Uniting and Anglican Church as organ player and organiser of the Kid's Club.


Premier's Australia Day Active Citizenship Award for a person under 25 years EMMA HEDLEY


Emma received her award for her community involvement since arriving in Eneabba in 2011. As soon as she arrived in town, Emma joined in all community events.


Premier's Australia Day Active Citizenship Award for a community group or event CARNAMAH TOWN CENTENARY & NMAS SHOW WEEKEND

- 31st January to 15th March 2014 (All Sectors)

ACCESSING WATER FROM THE ENEABBA AND CARNAMAH TOWN STANDPIPES


The standpipes in the Eneabba and Carnamah townships are now governed by way of electronic card access.

JURIEN POLICE REPORT

I hope everyone's Australia Day long weekend was an enjoyable one and you managed some time off to spend with family. It was a very busy time for us, particular during our operation down at Wedge Island.

Since New Years Eve we have been busy adapting our local policing strategies due to the alleged homicide at Wedge (which is in our area, not Lancelin's). As a direct result of the increased violence down there we needed to allocate additional resources for the Australia Day long weekend operations to ensure a safe family environment was maintained.

I requested an unprecedented level of support from other country police stations to mount an operation that would ensure we could manage the expected numbers at Wedge (can be as high as 7000-10,000 over a busy long weekend, which is more than we get in Jurien Bay). We were not there to attend to issues such as illegal camping as that was managed by the Department of Parks and Wildlife (DPaW), who also allocated additional resources to ensure the park was managed safely. Some of the additional police resources were utilised for tasking and patrols of Cervantes-Jurien Bay so the actual police numbers on duty exceeded what I would normally have out on a long weekend.

As I was based at the Command Post at Wedge running that operation and normal policing operations in our area I needed to leave the phone on divert to ensure there were no issues with calls not being received by our mobile phones in area of poor coverage. I can assure everyone we were working very long hours over the long weekend and some of us were working nightshift due to the additional demands placed on our resources. If at any stage you require police attendance and our phone is diverted, please select option one which will divert you to our Police Operations Centre. They can then look up where the nearest police vehicle is located and dispatch the job or call me and I will allocate it to someone. This system is used throughout regional WA to ensure phone calls don't just end up being diverted to an out of range mobile phone (which that vehicle may be away on another job for several hours).

The attached pictures are of our command post at Wedge and of a pen gun that was located in the sand at Wedge. This deadly weapon was probably discarded on NYE when police descended on the area in response to the homicide but it highlights our concerns about the increasing violence down there. As a result of the recent police and DPaW operations at Wedge there were no reported incidents and our attendance was well received by both residents and visitors. All vehicles entering the area proceeded through a check point and several vehicles were searched. One driver was charged with Excess 0.08% and another person received an infringement for consuming alcohol in the park however the majority of visitors abided by the laws relevant to that area. The area is now subject to an ongoing Zero Tolerance approach towards Street/Reserve Drinking, anti-social behaviour and driving related offences.

What I would like to say is that I was pleased with the overall behaviour of visitors and community members over the weekend and over the entire summer period. We have had a few incidents but overall there has been a significant drop in the number of disturbances, anti-social behaviour and incidents involving violence. The majority of the incidents we have attended were life threatening emergencies such as vehicle accidents, lost children and a total of three boats capsizing at sea. Our focus is now on hooning and vehicle related offences so please encourage everyone to report the

registration numbers and times/dates the incidents are occurring. We have seized numerous vehicles over the last few months for Hooning offences, with most vehicles being seized for 28 days.

I thank you for your support over the summer period and like you we are looking forward to quieter times for a couple of months before Easter.

Chicken and Vegetable Quesadillas

Ingredients

1 Red bell pepper, diced
1 Cup red kidney beans or Black beans, canned and drained
2. Chicken breast chopped in strips, thinly
2 Spring onions, cut into thin rings
4 large tortillas
200g grated cheddar cheese
Salt and pepper to taste

Method

1. Pre heat oven to 170°c
2. Mix the bell peppers, beans , chicken and scallions.
3. Lay two tortillas on a baking tray with parchment paper and scatter half of the cheese. Divide the mixed chicken and veggies between the two tortillas, season with salt and pepper and finish off with the rest of the cheese. Put another tortilla on top of each and press lightly. Bake in the oven for about 20 minutes. Cut in triangles and serve.
4. You can use sour cream and tomato salsa as side dish

Sweet and Sour Pork “Thai –Style”

Ingredients

350g lean pork
2 tbsp vegetable oil
4 garlic clove chopped
1 small red onion, sliced thinly
2 tbsp fish sauce
1 tbsp. sugar
1 red bell pepper , diced
½ cucumber seeded and thinly sliced
2 tomatoes, cut into wedges
4oz piece fresh pineapple, cut into small chunks
2 spring onions cut in short lengths
ground black pepper

Method

1. Cut Pork into thin strips.
2. Heat the oil in a large frying pan, add garlic. Cook until golden, then add the pork stir fry for 4-5 minutes. Add the onion slices and toss to mix.
3. Add the fish sauce, sugar and black pepper to taste. Continue cooking for 3-4 minutes.
4. Stir in the red bell pepper, cucumber, tomatoes, pineapple and spring onions. Stir fry 3-4 minutes more, then spoon to a bowl. Chop and Garnish with coriander and spring onions to serve.

Garlic Mussels with Chorizo “Mediterranean”


Ingredients

2kgs mussels
1 large white onion
200g chorizo
2 garlic cloves, chopped
Olive oil for frying
2 cups dry white wine
Fresh Parsley sprigs to garnish
Salt and pepper to taste

Method

1. Clean the mussels by scrubbing the shells and pulling out any beards that are attached to them.
2. Roughly chop the onion, Remove the skin from the chorizo and roughly chop. Heat the olive oil in a large saucepan and fry the onions for 2-3 minutes until softened.
3. Add the white wine and add the mussels. Season with pepper and cover the pan, bring to the boil and lower to medium heat for 5 minutes until mussels open.
4. Using a slotted spoon, discard any mussels that have not opened . Serve and garnish with parsley.


