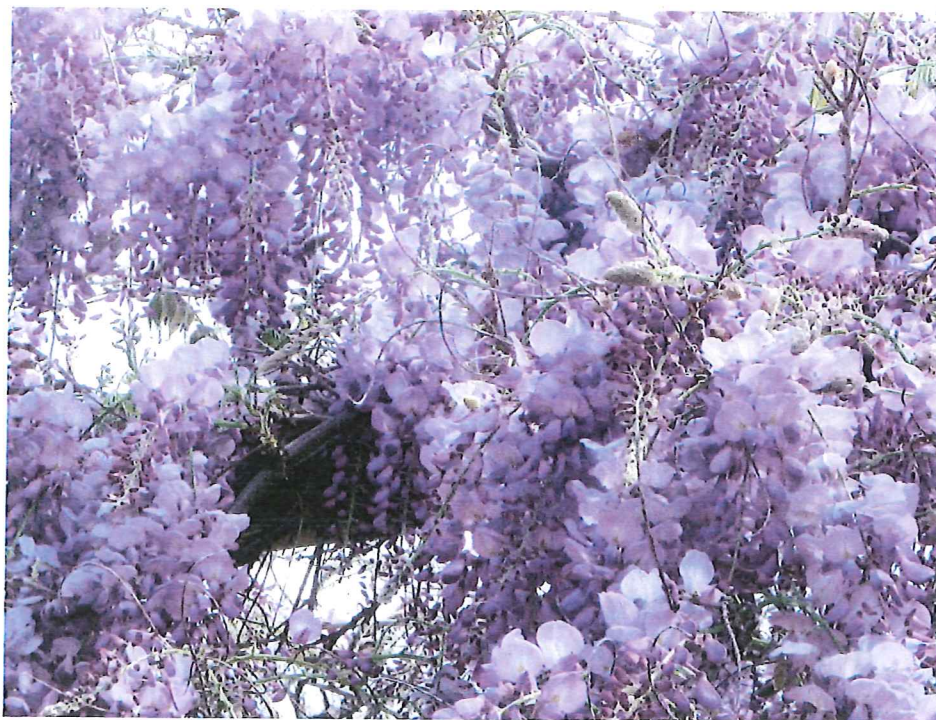

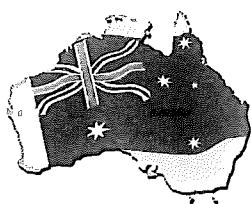
I was delighted to be able to meet *Liz

Apparently a lot of those present did not know it was written by a man.

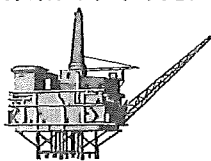

ENEABBA PRIMARY SCHOOL UPDATE

The school year has started well with 37 students currently enrolled at Eneabba Primary School. In 2014 a two class structure will occur with Kindergarten- Year 3 students with Miss Emma Hedley and Year 3-7 students with Mr Charlie Whiu.

ICT Focus

As part of our school's strategic plan, the inclusion of Information Communication & Technology (ICT) within the teaching and learning process will continue to be a focus in the school. In 2013 the school allocated significant resources to upgrade ICT infrastructure (e.g. new computers, servers and wireless internet additions), up-skilling our school community's ICT skills and implementing ICT-enriched experiences into our classrooms. This development is underpinned by the ICT capability of the Australian Curriculum and ensuring we prepared our students to be active citizens in the 21st century.

Traffic Management Around Our School

As part of our road safety focus last year, modifications were made to the school boundaries to improve traffic management around the school. The area in focus was in relation to the collection of junior room students and the bus bay areas. The school requests that community members park their vehicles in the car park in Dewar St and not along Sandplain Rd where the buses pull in and out from. Having young students crossing a road with moving buses is very dangerous and we have put these modifications in place to hopefully prevent an incident from occurring. Your support with this is greatly appreciated.

School Initiatives in 2014

At Eneabba Primary School we are continuously looking at ways to improve the educational outcomes for all students. I would like to highlight some of the initiatives the school will be working towards over the course of the year:

- Establishing a whole-school approach towards developing resilience with our students;
- A strong focus on developing students' application of Mathematical language, financial Mathematics and problem solving skills;
- Commencing the implementation of the Words Their Way spelling program;
- Enhancing the use of ICT within the teaching and learning process;
- Involvement in the Independent Public Schools (IPS) development program in the hope of achieving IPS status for 2015; and
- The continued implementation and reporting of student progress in line with the Australian Curriculum.

CREATIVE COOKING and Cooking hints



I included a recipe not so long ago in the Eneabba NEWS for "Hunter's Chicken". Well I tasted this while I was in England and it was very good but a little too much with the soya sauce!!

This quiche is lovely hot or cold and great with salad.

Three cheese and mushroom crustless quiche

Ingredients:

150g or button mushrooms, sliced thinly.
2 green onions sliced finely
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup (60g) finely grated cheddar cheese
 $\frac{1}{3}$ cup (25g) finely grated parmesan cheese
125g camembert cheese sliced thinly
3 eggs
1 cup (250ml) cream

$\frac{1}{2}$ cup (125ml) milk
 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup (35g) plain flour

Method

Preheat oven to moderate

Combine mushrooms and onion in oiled shallow 1.75litre (7 cup) ovenproof dish.

Sprinkle with cheddar and parmesan cheeses; arrange camembert on top.

Whisk eggs, cream, milk and flour together in large bowl; pour over cheeses in dish.

Bake, uncovered in moderate oven for about 30 minutes or until just set.

Serves 4.

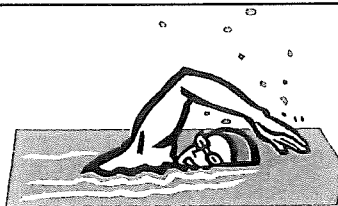

JURIEN BAY POLICE NEWS

A recent incident occurred in Jurien Bay which hopefully serves as a reminder that antisocial behaviour will not be tolerated by Jurien Bay Police and where the evidence exists, action will be taken and this may include being charged or penalised.

On Friday the 7th of February, Police received numerous reports that a male had been displaying aggressive behaviour in Jurien Bay. It was also reported that he had threatened a primary school student and damaged a vehicle. Inquiries were conducted by Jurien Bay Police and the male person was identified. He was subsequently charged with disorderly and damage offences.

Jurien Bay Police would also like to remind local residents to secure their valuables and lock their vehicles. "We have received recent reports that unlocked vehicles have been accessed and items have been stolen from within", said First Class Constable Kristy Cannon. PLEASE REMOVE YOUR VALUABLES, even when you lock your vehicle, and place other items such as navigation equipment and esbies out of sight.

Sgt Darren Slys would also like to remind motorists that police will be monitoring vehicle speeds in the 40km Per Hour School Zones across the shire now that the children have returned to school. The wearing of seatbelts and bicycle helmets will also be monitored. "Most accidents occur within minutes of your home or planned destination and more children are killed today as car passengers than in any other form of transport, so please make sure your children are wearing bicycle helmets and all children in a vehicle are seated in the correct Child Car Restraint" he said.

The laws require children from:

***Birth to under 6 months** to be restrained in a rearward facing child restraint (e.g. infant capsule)

***6 months to under 4 years** to be restrained in either a rearward or forward facing child restraint with in-built harness

***4 years to under 7 years** to be restrained in either a forward facing child restraint or booster seat restrained by a correctly adjusted and fastened seat belt or child safety harness.

Also, children under 4 years are not allowed to sit in the front seat of a vehicle with two or more rows of seats, and those from 4 years to under 7 years are only allowed to sit in the front seats if all rear seats are occupied by children less than 7 years of age.

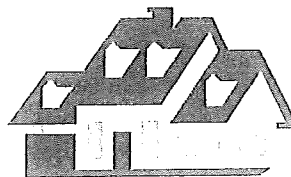
Children 7 years and over can be restrained in an adult seat belt or booster seat.

GO AHEAD FOR **ENEABBA AND **CARNAMAH** REVITALISATION PROJECTS!!**



On Monday 17th February, Mr Shane Love MLA Member for Moore and Hon. Martin Aldridge MLC visited Carnamah to announce the funding of the Eneabba and Carnamah Revitalisation Projects. The amount of \$356,233 has been approved from the Mid West Investment Plan. This together with funding from the Country Local Government Fund (CLGF), Shire of Carnamah, CBH and the Department of Veteran's Affairs will see a total project value of \$712,466.

The funding announcement came two years since the commencement of the process and was greeted with pleasure by Shire of Carnamah Councillors and staff. Trevor Price from the Mid West Development Commission who has been an integral part of the application since it was first presented was also in attendance.

Parts of the project have already been completed in both towns with CLGF funding. In Eneabba this includes the fencing of the Horseman's Oval; two shelters and a new Information Board. Entrance signage is awaiting approval from Main Roads. In Carnamah a solid playground shelter in Yarra Park; Tourist Information Bay; photos in windows and fencing of the Landcare and Childcare centres have been completed.

The next step will be to revisit the rest of the project; finalise costings and get it happening. Jenny Hayley will continue to be contracted to the Shire to work on the implementation.

The members of the Eneabba and Carnamah Community Reference Groups have been instrumental in helping with the Projects and the Councillors and staff thank them for their help in getting the project to this stage.

Community Monitoring of Seabirds

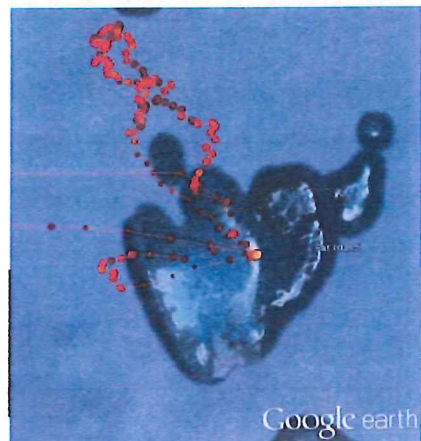
New research to find out where seabirds are feeding acts as predictive indicators of oceanic conditions, with particular relevance to fisheries and marine reserves.

The research, coordinated by the Northern Agricultural Catchments Council (NACC), brings together experts from around the world, including the Conservation Council of WA (CCWA), the Department of Fisheries, seabird biologists Dr Jill Shephard and Dr Chris Surman and the University of Amsterdam, to engage coastal communities in monitoring seabird foraging patterns along WA's west coast.

According to Dr Nic Dunlop, seabird biologist and Citizen Science Co-ordinator at the CCWA, the project team recently trialed the methodology by fitting tiny radio trackers to two Sooty Terns at the Abrolhos Islands. These terns spent days feeding out at sea, and upon their return, the GPS information from their trackers was automatically downloaded to a base station at the Saville Kent Centre on Rat Island.

At the start of the next breeding season later this year, more trackers will be fitted to Sooty Terns at the Abrolhos Islands and to Brown Noddies at Lancelin Island. Tracking data will be collected over a number of successive breeding seasons before the project is finalised.

In the last decade WA fisheries have experienced substantial change as a result of altered oceanic processes. In the face of continued changes, new bio-indicators serve as tools in fishery and biodiversity management. Seabird foraging patterns are linked to ocean productivity, which means that seabirds can be used to gather information on fisheries.

"The initial tracking data shows that the two Sooty Terns fed in completely different locations" says Dr Dunlop. "This was unexpected and might indicate that two different foraging strategies are employed by these birds during chick rearing, known as 'bi-modal foraging'. If this proves to be the case, it will be the first time this behaviour has been discovered in a tern species".

Royalties for Regions and country Local Governments under attack

Nationals Member for the Agricultural Region Martin Aldridge MLC has today criticised some Liberal MPs for being out of touch with regional Western Australia.

As Parliament resumed this week, two Liberal Members voiced their support for the amalgamation of regional local governments, and another has called for *Royalties for Regions* to be scrapped.

In a speech to the Legislative Assembly yesterday, Hillarys MLA Rob Johnson called directly for the scrapping of *Royalties for Regions*, claiming the program was untenable, discriminatory and its abolition was morally the right thing to do.

Mr Johnson also claimed that others in the Liberal Party supported his view.

Mr Aldridge condemned Mr Johnson's claims, saying *Royalties for Regions* was essential to address the gap that still exists between services and infrastructure available in WA's regions compared to metropolitan Perth.

"In 2008 the retiring chief executive of the WA Country Health Service described regional health as 'blatantly bloody unsafe' and blamed metro centric bureaucrats and politicians for inaction," Mr Aldridge said.

"Royalties for Regions is rebuilding hospitals and nursing posts, attracting and retaining GPs, supporting ambulance services, building aged care facilities, introducing technology into medical centres through telehealth, funding the Royal Flying Doctor Service and will this year launch the State's second dedicated medical rescue helicopter in the South West of the State.

"If Mr Johnson and his Liberal colleagues feel morally obliged to abolish *Royalties for Regions*, they can bring a bill to the Parliament to do just that, however, The Nationals will vigorously oppose any attack on Australia's most important regional development program."

Mr Johnson was a Member of Parliament and a member of the Cabinet that approved the creation of *Royalties for Regions* by legislation following the 2008 State election.

"At the last state election The Nationals said that the only way to protect *Royalties for Regions* was to vote for us, and it now seems we were right," Mr Aldridge said.

"Our regions contribute significantly to the State's economy and will play a large part in the future growth of our State.

"We must recognise and support that contribution with the continuation of *Royalties for Regions*."

Permits must be obtained during Restricted Burning times.

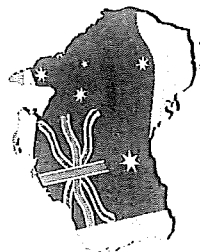
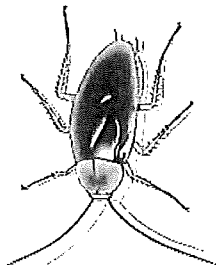
