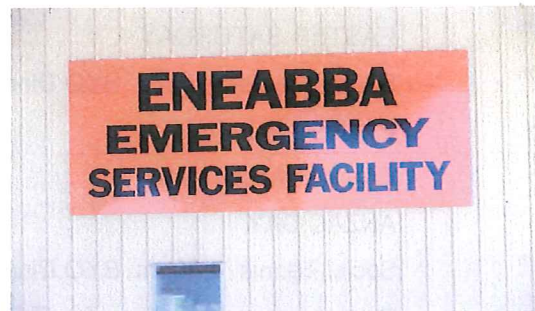

Jeffery Deaver.

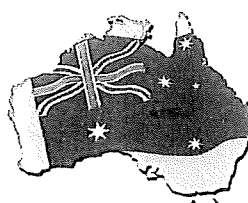
Jeffery Deaver has created the most riveting and

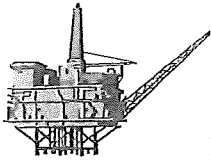

ICT Focus

As part of our school's strategic plan, the inclusion of Information Communication & Technology (ICT) within the teaching and learning process will continue to be a focus in the school. In 2013 the school allocated significant resources to upgrade ICT infrastructure (e.g. new computers, servers and wireless internet additions), up-skilling our school community's ICT skills and implementing ICT-enriched experiences into our classrooms. This development is underpinned by the ICT capability of the Australian Curriculum and ensuring we prepared our students to be active citizens in the 21st century.

Traffic Management Around Our School

As part of our road safety focus last year, modifications were made to the school boundaries to improve traffic management around the school. The area in focus was in relation to the collection of junior room students and the bus bay areas. The school requests that community members park their vehicles in the car park in Dewar St and not along Sandplain Rd where the buses pull in and out from. Having young students crossing a road with moving buses is very dangerous and we have put these modifications in place to hopefully prevent an incident from occurring. Your support with this is greatly appreciated.

School Initiatives in 2014

At Eneabba Primary School we are continuously looking at ways to improve the educational outcomes for all students. I would like to highlight some of the initiatives the school will be working towards over the course of the year:

- Establishing a whole-school approach towards developing resilience with our students;
- A strong focus on developing students' application of Mathematical language, financial Mathematics and problem solving skills;

- Commencing the implementation of the Words Their Way spelling program;
- Enhancing the use of ICT within the teaching and learning process;
- Involvement in the Independent Public Schools (IPS) development program in the hope of achieving IPS status for 2015; and
- The continued implementation and reporting of student progress in line with the Australian Curriculum.

YOUR VEGETABLE GARDEN

Well the experts are saying keep shade over your garden veggies (If you have any left!!!!) and another couple of weeks should see us ready to go. It is still very hot and

last year when I and my friend planted early - nothing did very well.

Hint: Now is the time to pull out any crab grass before it sets seed.

Experts say plant your last lot of stevia, chia, pumpkins, watermelons and rock melons for this year.

TURN UP THE HEAT

Chilli and garlic spray

Ingredients

3 large cloves garlic, crushed

Chillies, finely chopped (Chop with gloves on to avoid stinging eyes later on. If you rub your eyes the chilli will sting).

2 tbsp liquid soap or olive oil

One litre of water

Method

Combine the garlic, chillies and oil and leave to soak overnight. Strain and add to the litre of water along with the liquid soap. Use on plants regularly.

Garlic and chilli spray. Great for tomatoes and other vegetables and fruit. Protects from insects and has great antifungal and antibacterial properties.

Anyone make the Ginger Slice?

TOFFEE This is quite an old recipe!!

Ingredients

2 cups sugar

1 level tsp cream of tartar

1 cup water

Flavouring

Method

1. Put sugar, water and cream of tartar into saucepan. Bring to boil slowly.

2. Wipe down the inside of the pan with a wet brush. (Basting brush/paint brush?)

3. Boil quickly, without stirring, until the toffee reaches "large crack".

NOTE: Large crack test is done by dropping a small quantity of the toffee into very cold water. It should be short, brittle and break when bitten.

4. Remove from heat, add essence, stir.

5. Pour into greased tins and when nearly set, mark into desired shapes.

6. When cold wrap in wax paper and store in an air tight tin.

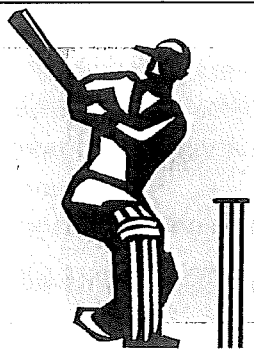

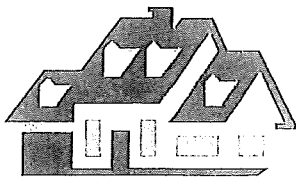

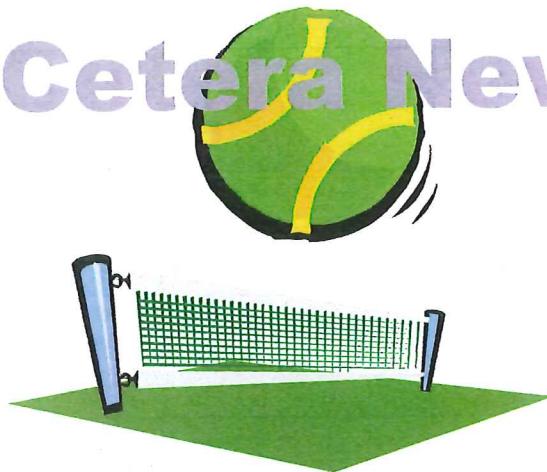

1st November 2013 to 31st January 2014 (West of Brand Mudge Road)

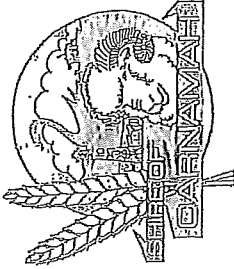
RESTRICTED (Permit Required)

ACCESSING WATER FROM THE ENELABBA AND CARNAMAH TOWN STANDPIPES
