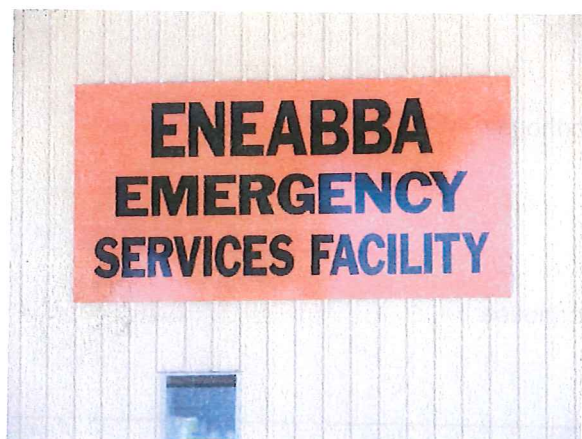

Did you know about the monitoring of seabirds? Please check out separate page in

issue 423 from NACC on new research to find out where seabirds are feeding acts as predictive indicators of oceanic conditions, with particular relevance to fisheries and marine reserves.

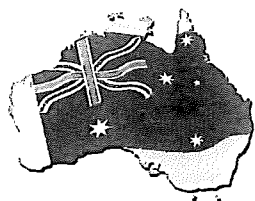
A Musical Eye: The Visual world of Britten and Pears.

Edited by Judith LeGrove

Although better known for their music, Benjamin Britten and Peter Pears were avid collectors and supporters of the visual arts. Part Catalogue of their collection and part biography, this contains contributions from people who knew them. It makes for absorbing reading and there is an intimacy and immediacy that is appealing, heightened by the use of photographs and other images from the period. Given its scope, this book

will appeal not just to Britten and Pears fans but to those with an interest in 20th century art and social history.

Editor's Note: I was lucky to find time to visit the "Snape Maltings" in England which has the Benjamin Britten Auditorium on site. It is housed in one of several restored buildings which formerly created the 'maltings' for making beer.



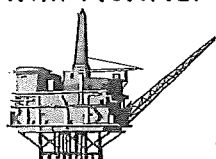

ICT Focus

As part of our school's strategic plan, the inclusion of Information Communication & Technology (ICT) within the teaching and learning process will continue to be a focus in the school. In 2013 the school allocated significant resources to upgrade ICT infrastructure (e.g. new computers, servers and wireless internet additions), up-skilling our school community's ICT skills and implementing ICT-enriched experiences into our classrooms. This development is underpinned by the ICT capability of the Australian Curriculum and ensuring we prepared our students to be active citizens in the 21st century.

Traffic Management Around Our School

As part of our road safety focus last year, modifications were made to the school boundaries to improve traffic management around the school. The area in focus was in relation to the collection of junior room students and the bus bay areas. The school requests that community members park their vehicles in the car park in Dewar St and not along Sandplain Rd where the buses pull in and out from. CREATIVE COOKING and Cooking hints



Coconut cakes with pineapple and Mint syrup

Ingredients

Cake

150g soft butter

$\frac{3}{4}$ cup brown sugar

3 eggs

$\frac{2}{3}$ cup self raising flour

$\frac{1}{4}$ cup desiccated coconut

$\frac{1}{4}$ cup light coconut milk

Mint syrup

$\frac{3}{4}$ cup water

$\frac{1}{3}$ cup caster sugar

3 sprigs mint

300g naturally sweet pineapple, skin removed, finely diced

1 tbs shredded mint leaves

Method

1. Preheat oven to 180 deg C. Grease a 6 hole muffin tray with a little of the butter.

2. Beat remaining butter and sugar together using electric beaters for 5 minutes or until creamy and pale. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Lightly fold in flour and coconut until just combined. Gently stir in coconut milk.

3. Divide mixture between muffin holes and bake for 20-25 minutes or until golden and cooked through. Allow to cool in tray for 5 minutes.

4. Meanwhile, to prepare the mint syrup. Place water, sugar and mint sprigs in a small saucepan. Stir over medium heat until sugar has dissolved. Simmer for 5-8 minutes or until syrup has thickened slightly. Remove mint sprigs, stir in diced pineapple pieces and shredded mint. Set aside to cool.

5. To serve, turn coconut cakes out onto serving plates. Spoon the mint syrup over. Serve.

DID YOU KNOW?

"Vermin championships, a success for the west midlands"

Two West Midlands Group (WMG) Vermin Championship events, took place on the weekend of the 21-23 February, one in Dandaragan and the other in Eneabba. Winners of the "Best Shooting Team" shields, were the "Badgy Killers" (Tim Dean, Sean Nelson and Nicola Smith) of Badgingarra who culled 22 foxes, 1 cat and 59 rabbits and "Whitey and Coops" (Ashley Cooper, James White and Gavin White) of Eneabba culling 12 foxes, 1 cat and 43 rabbits.

Farmers with a registered firearms license were encouraged to go shooting on Friday and Saturday nights. This was followed by a tail count and a BBQ breakfast. In total, there were 73 foxes, 3 cats and 314 rabbits culled over the weekend by farmer teams!!!

Vouchers were also awarded to the winning teams, generously donated by Landmark Moora and the Eneabba General Store. Staff from Rabobank also cooked the delicious BBQ breakfast in Dandaragan. The West Midlands Group would also like to thank Chris and Peta Sattler for hosting the event in Dandaragan and also Geoff Hortin who hosted the one in Eneabba.

For every fox and feral cat culled, five dollars will be donated by Stockbrands to the Royal Flying Doctors Service (RFDS). Stockbrands values the efforts shown by farmers in protecting livestock and biodiversity assets. The RFDS donations also ultimately go towards looking after the people in our rural communities. Local grower groups, such as the West Midlands Group see the value in supporting a cause that delivers environmental, economic and social benefits, and would like to thank everyone who made this event another success.

This weekend, will be followed by a 'hot' baiting period commencing 24 February to 18 April. The West Midlands Group is offering free fox and rabbit baits to their members, funding of which has been sourced from the State Government.
