Patient Assisted Travel Scheme (PATs) review launched

We need your help to make sure this scheme continues to grow and improve in regional WA

PATs is an important program aiming to provide subsidised access to specialist medical care for regional people, regardless of where you live.

Thanks to community and patient feedback we know the system is problematic and doesn't adequately meet the needs of regional patients requiring specialist medical care.

The Nationals recently called for a parliamentary inquiry to examine the strengths and weaknesses of the program. The Public Administration Committee will now review PATs and provide recommendations to improve the scheme.

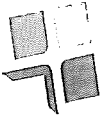

Jurien Bay Police Report

The first week of the school holidays has been a busy one with local police attending tasks ranging from noise complaints to an alleged sex assault.

Car Thief Runs out of Fuel

At Saturday April 12, 2014 Jurien bay Police assisted with an incident in Leeman. A 28 year old male from Geraldton was driving a vehicle towards Leeman when it ran out of fuel. He walked into Leeman but as the fuel station was not yet open he walked around until he located a vehicle parked on a verge with the keys in the ignition. He then stole that vehicle and drove to Green Head for the purpose of buying fuel for his own vehicle. Unfortunately he did not check the fuel gauge in the stolen vehicle as it ran out of fuel on the corner of Indian Ocean Drive and The Lakes Road, Green Head. He then left this vehicle and walked towards Green Head carrying a fuel can. Residents from Leeman observed him walking away from the vehicle and called police. He was arrested a short time later and conveyed to Jurien Bay Police Station. Colin John Hancock was bailed to appear at the Jurien Bay Magistrate's Court on April 17 but failed to appear on that date therefore an Arrest Warrant was granted by the Court.

Sex Assault

On Tuesday April 15, police from Jurien Bay, Leeman and Dongara Police Stations and staff from Geraldton Detectives and Geraldton Forensic attended an alleged sexual assault at an address in Jurien Bay. A 37 year old male from Northam was arrested and conveyed to the Jurien Bay Police Station where he was later charged with Criminal Damage and Aggravated Sexual Penetration without Consent on a 29 year old female.

Truck Chaos

On Good Friday police attended a traffic hazard where a truck company operating in the Shire unhitched two trailers on the south bound lane of Indian Ocean Driver near Jurien East Road, Jurien Bay. The drivers abandoned the trailers and proceeded to make delivery of their loads. The placement of these vehicles caused traffic chaos in this 110km zone when motorists needed to travel on the incorrect side of the road to negated the obstacle. As a result police were required to manage the traffic for approximately two hours whilst they awaited the return of the trucks. The drivers were interviewed and police will liaise with Main Roads regarding this incident with the view to prosecute them for this dangerous act.

Jurien Bay Police Report

Easter

Police responded to a total of 19 complaints from the community over the Easter long weekend which was a significant reduction from last year. "We attended noise complaints, fuel stealing, domestic violence incidents, suspicious people reports, vehicles hooning, intoxicated people causing disturbances and overdue boats to name just a few", said Sergeant Darren Slyn of Jurien Bay Police. The Zero Tolerance to Street Drinking strategy to reduce disturbances, damage and violence is continuing to be an effective tool to manage the issues. Over the long weekend a total of 40 cautions were issued for Street/Reserve Drinking and only two infringements were issued. The crime figures are a huge reduction compared to last year and the number of alcohol related incidents has also decreased significantly. A Zero Tolerance approach is a formal directive to local police that they must deal with every occurrence. Zero Tolerance does not mean an automatic infringement. Police have discretionary powers therefore it is up to the individual officer to decide if a caution or infringement is appropriate given the individual circumstances. Refusal to stop drinking or abusive/offensive behaviour towards police is likely to result in an officer electing to issue an infringement rather than a caution. Most people appreciate the warning and stop the act immediately without incident.

New Strategy to Target Hooning Offences

In response to the numerous complaints of speeding through local streets and the incidents involving reckless driving and 'burnouts' Jurien Bay Police have deployed a new weapon to tackle the situation. "We have deployed an unmarked vehicle during the peak times that these incidents are occurring. This will allow police to observe the behaviour more effectively then apprehend the offenders" said Sergeant Darren Slyn. Jurien Bay Police have seized several vehicles for similar Hooning offences over the last few months. The drivers were charged with offences such as Reckless Driving and the vehicles were impounded for up to 28 days. Drivers are then required to pay the daily impounding fee which could total around \$2000.00.

Noise Complaints

Both the Shire of Dandaragan and Jurien Bay Police are responsible for attending to noise complaints, depending on the circumstances. The Environmental Protection Act 1986 (the Act) states "noise includes vibration of any frequency, whether transmitted through air or any other physical medium." The Environmental Protection (Noise) Regulations 1997 (the Regulations) operate as a prescribed standard under the Act and set limits on noise emissions. Local governments use the Regulations to deal with domestic, commercial and general industry noise, while the Department of Environment Regulation deals with industries that are prescribed premises under the Act. The police deal with such activities as noisy parties, using the 'unreasonable noise' provisions of the Act, instead of the Regulations. For information on the definition of unreasonable noise, refer to subsection 3(3) of the Act. In relation to anti-social behaviour or

noisy parties, please contact the police if a courtesy call or visit to your neighbour did not resolve the problem. Do not let it get to the stage a physical altercation is imminent.

Drug Behaviour Results in Threats to Family

On Wednesday 9th April 2014 Jurien Bay Police responded to a complaint of Threats to Harm/Injure. The situation involved a 20 year old man from Jurien Bay threatening his family after he was asked to move out of the family house. The man, who was suffering from the effects of drug abuse was arrested and conveyed to Geraldton Police Station where his extreme violent behaviour resulted in him being further charged. He was bailed with Protective bail conditions not to approach his family members or their house.

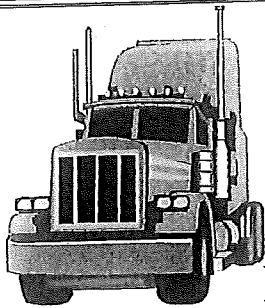

Natural Resource Management in Western Australia

2014 Community grants NOW OPEN!

The State Government has pledged \$2.7 million towards the 2014 State NRM Program Community Grants to support activities of local community groups.

Grants of between \$10 000 and \$50 000 are available for activities that help conserve, restore, rehabilitate or enhance a local natural area or conserve biodiversity. On-ground works, as well as planning, training and resource assessment activities are eligible.

Who can apply

Schools, industry groups, not-for-profit organisations, local governments and community groups in regional and metropolitan areas of Western Australia can apply.

State Government agencies, regional NRM organisations, universities and individuals are not eligible to apply directly but may partner with eligible groups.

Applicants can lodge more than one project and current and past applicants can apply.

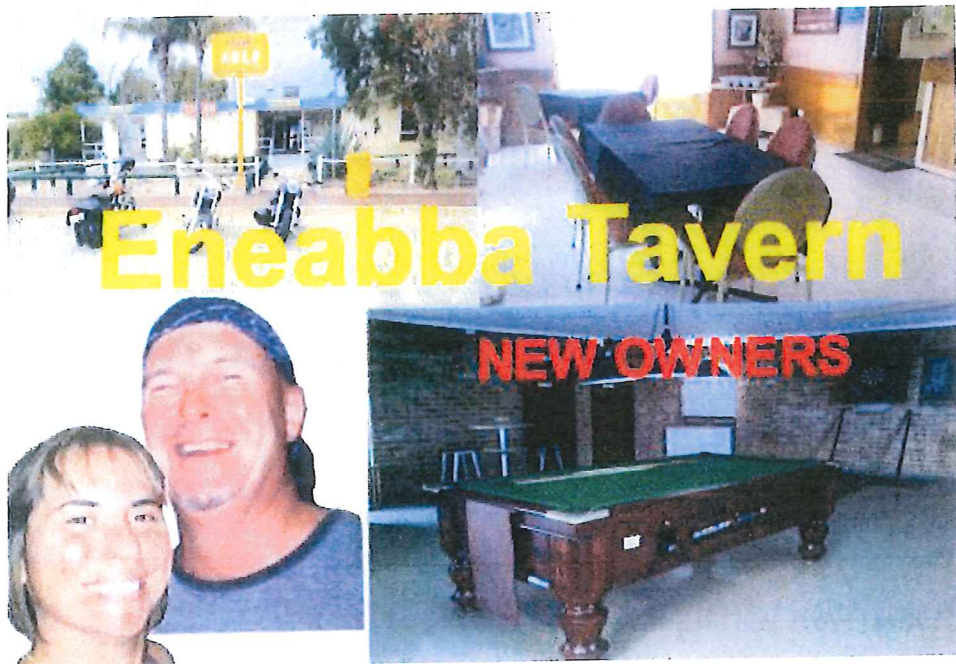
